This issue of the WTE&TE, Vol.13, No.2, features 16 articles in total, with all but one article coming from authors based in the People's Republic of China (PRC). The single article comes from a group of authors from Greece. In making this issue available to the global community, it is my pleasure to acknowledge, with thanks, the special effort of the WIETE Editorial Team that includes Dr Dianne Q. Nguyen, Mrs Dorota I.
