## World Transactions on Engineering and Technology Education

## Editorial

This issue of the World Transactions on Engineering and Technology Education (WTE&TE), marked Vol.16, No.2, consists of 16 highly informative articles that have come from 11 countries worldwide. Three articles have come from each of Indonesia, Poland, Slovakia, one article from each of Canada, Israel, Slovenia, Taiwan and the United Arab Emirates, as well as two joint articles, one from Kazakhstan/Russia and the other from Poland/Australia. Some of the articles originated in relation to the 2018 Conference on Engineering and Architecture Design Education to take place at Slovak University of Technology in Bratislava, Bratislava, Slovakia, between 11 and 14 June 2018. The other articles are regular contributions submitted recently to the Journal.

An editorial decision has been made to reserve two consecutive issues of the WTE&TE (Vol.16, No.3 and Vol.16, No.4) for publishing papers that will originate at two forthcoming conferences to be held in Bratislava (as mentioned above), and the *6th Mediterranean Seminar on Engineering and Technology Education* to be held at the University of West Attica in Piraeus-Athens, which will be held between 10 and 14 September this year.

It is my pleasant duty to report that organisation on the *6th Mediterranean Seminar on Engineering and Technology Education* under the overarching theme *Regional Collaboration* is presently in full swing. A relatively large number of presentations and paper proposals have been received, suggesting that the Seminar will be a great success. This Seminar will be held at the University of West Attica, based in Piraeus-Athens, Greece. This is a new institution that eventuated over the last few months from the amalgamation of a couple of academic institutions in Athens, including Piraeus University of Applied Sciences (PUAS) in Piraeus-Athens. The Seminar is being organised by the WIETE in collaboration with the Mediterranean Centre for Engineering and Technology Education (MCE&TE), a *satellite centre* of the WIETE, which is based at the University of West Attica, between 10 and 14 September 2018, with Professor George Metaxas, a Vice-President of the WIETE-IAAC, as its Director. Based on the abstracts of proposed papers, it is envisaged that a wide range of issues concerning engineering and technology education will be raised and discussed during the Seminar.

I should also mention at this point that a decision was made to stage the *10th Jubilee WIETE Annual Conference on Engineering and Technology Education* of the WIETE, under the overarching theme *Promoting Research and Development on Engineering and Technology Education* at Cinnamon Residence in Bangkok, Thailand, between 18 and 22 February 2019. This Conference will commence year-long celebrations of the activities and achievements of the WIETE.

In conclusion, I would like to take this opportunity to thank the authors for their contributions to this issue of the WTE&TE and look forward to getting their valuable contributions to forthcoming WIETE events.
