## **Editorial**

Moreover, November is usually the best month to visit Thailand as the climate then is very pleasant.

Despite this adversity, I wish to emphasise that our publication plans have not changed and the WIETE journals will be published on time, and other international meetings will be carried out as scheduled. Hence, the release of the first issue of the WTE&TE, Vol.18, No.1 in 2020, includes 13 highly informative articles, dealing predominantly with architectural engineering education, are envisaged to be presented at the impending WIETE Annual Conference. The other plans of the WIETE for 2020 include the 2020 Conference on Engineering and Architecture Design Education (EADE-2020) to be held in the Faculty of Architecture at Gdańsk University of Technology, Gdańsk, Poland, between 15 and 19 June 2020, and the 8th Mediterranean Seminar on Engineering and Technology Education, scheduled for Athens, Greece, between 14 and 18 September 2020.
